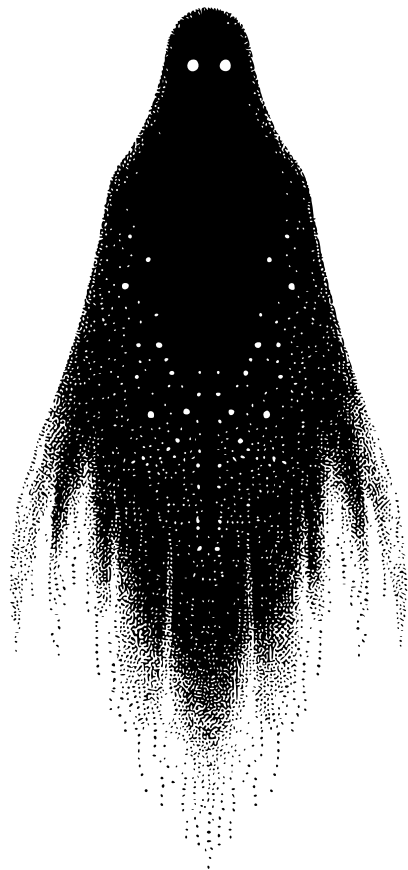
- despair - a state of having no hope at all

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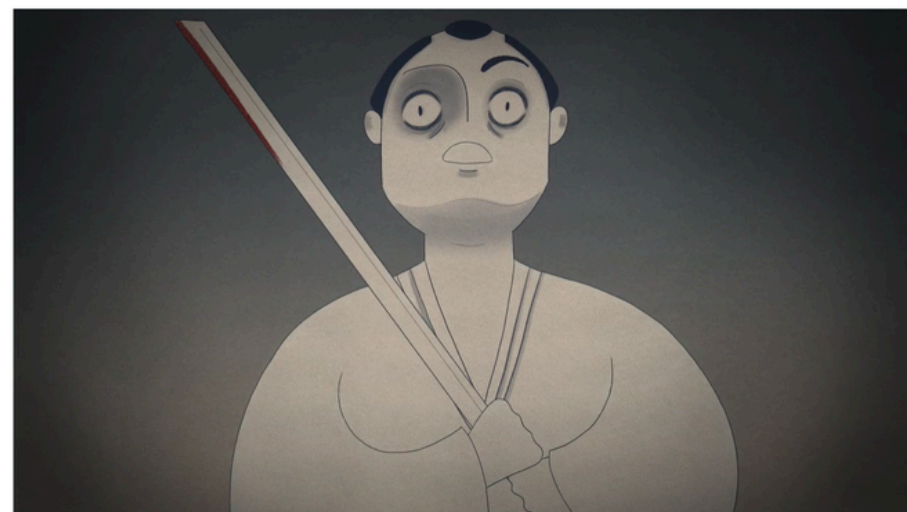
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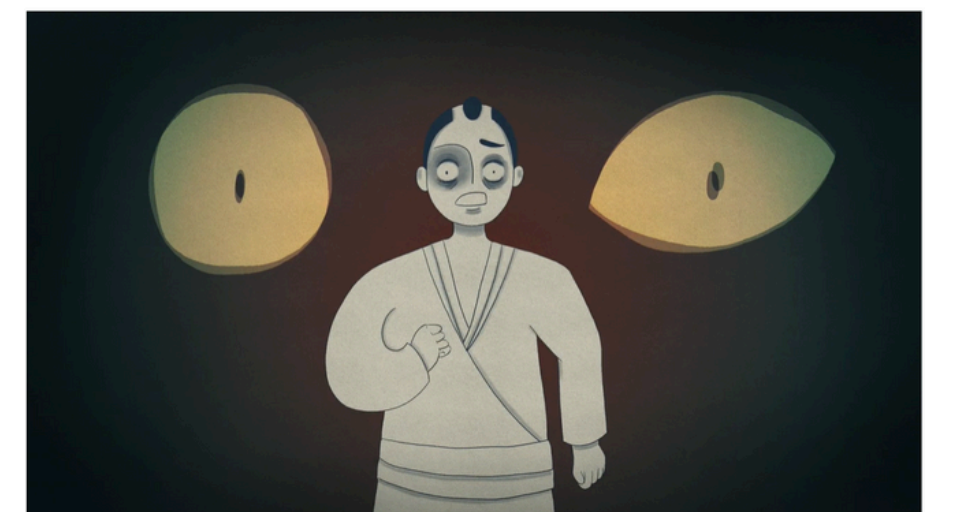
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Rewrite the story!

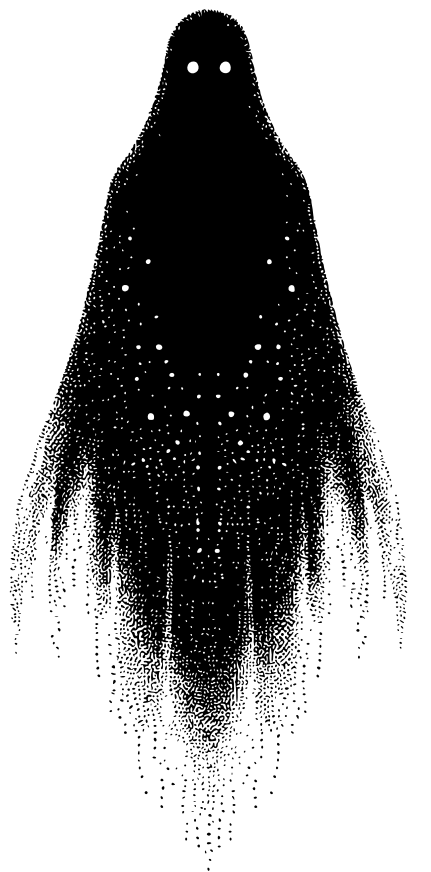
Rewrite Oiwa's story by changing one key element.

- Another creative idea of your own

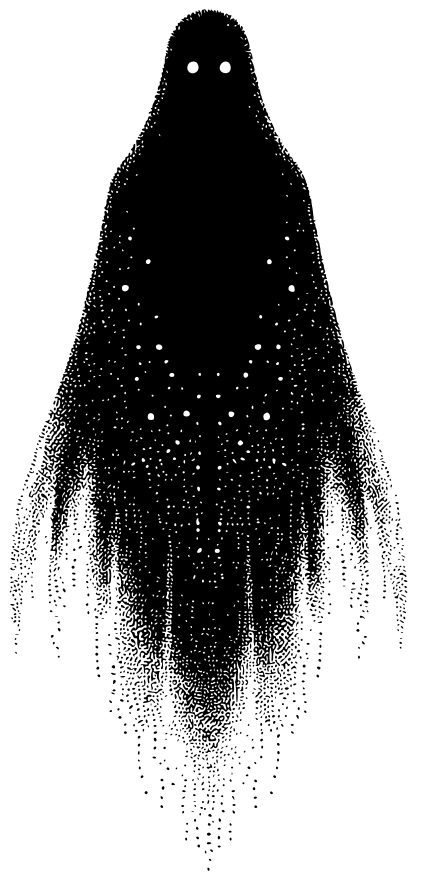
Discuss:

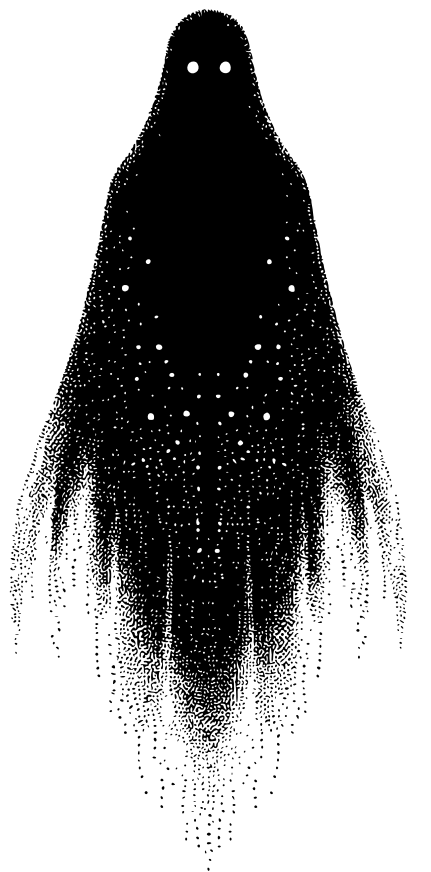
